Letter from the president

Hello Gardeners All,

I now have 3 booklets on **FOGO** from the Council, in **Mandarin** ... please ring me if you would like one.

In early June I saved many **sweet potato** pieces and put them in water to root. In mid-July I potted these well rooted pieces into 80mm pots to grow on for mid spring planting. For all those who wish to try growing them for the roots or just for the leaves to stir fry, I will have some for the Trading Table. They need to be in a frost-free spot.

Our thanks to Dr Margaret Salter for her many hours of work preparing an appropriate Privacy Policy for the garden club. This is in line with the policy of Garden Clubs Australia, and has been inserted into our website: **doncastergardenclubaus.com** Margaret and Todd Yu have also put in work updating and adding to the website. In mid-July I was planning which **tomato varieties** to grow and am favouring some shorter bushier types with early fruiting (7-8 weeks after transplant). This saves all the watering in the heat of summer when one doesn't wish to be out in it. Hopefully, it will also prevent Queensland Fruit Fly attack as the weather will still have colder moments. It seems the OFF doesn't do much/any damage before Christmas (so far in my experience with berries). As these shorter varieties tend to fruit more at once, I can net them for a shorter time. Cropping over 2-3weeks is useful for preserving (drying, chutney, bottling or saucing) as well as being able to remove the plants sooner to grow some cabbages or other leafy greens. I also do a couple of later varieties as I have favourites in Tommy Toe and Black Plum - 10 weeks from transplanting. All tomato seeds will be planted and on a hot mat in late July or early August. Do have baits and nets to cover tomato crops before Christmas. Finding maggots in your tomatoes is very confronting. Shorter 'time to fruit' tomato varieties are Beams Yellow Pear, the orange Jaune Flamme, le Case di Apulia & the Purple Ukrainian which are 7-8 weeks after transplanting. Beefsteak varieties take 12-14 weeks which is mid to late summer or ask at your nursery.

Ryset Orders can be brought to Club and handed in this month please.

The **Sheep Manure Order** pick up date is still to be organised.


